Non-Motorised Users Route—Feasibility Study

A non-motorised user (NMU) route is a route suitable for use by pedestrians, cyclists, equestrians, etc.

This feasibility study is investigating the options available for a NMU route between Hilton and Fenstanton and then on to the guided busway in St Ives.

The aim is to reduce motorised travel and therefore air pollution, ease access to the guided busway and improve fitness and health.

Parish Council Recommendations

Hilton Parish Council met on Monday 4th November and resolved that their recommended route is the route 2 option and they welcome the opportunity to add ideas and preferences in the detailed design phase to consider means by which we can reduce traffic speeds, minimising impact on land, cost and disruption.

Hilton Parish Council are pleased with the depth of cover of the study and the detail of the report.

They are also impressed with the willingness of Transport Initiatives to respond to the public comments and ideas raised at the previous open meeting.

Open Meeting

There will be an open meeting to discuss the final report and the recommendations on Monday 18th November at 7:30pm at the Methodist Church.

The purpose of this meeting will be to hear the parishioners views on the feasibility report recommendations and the Parish Councils decision.

There will also be an opportunity to hear about the next steps following this report.
